


Fall Flying

President's Corner

The peak flying season is over and the days are getting much shorter now. It's tough to get out in the evenings. This still leaves the weekends and it is important that we all adhere to our published field schedule for our respective fields. We must not be flying before noon on Sundays at either field and we need to meet the noise limits at West Field. The noise meter is stored in the field box at the field. You need help to check your plane, so don't hesitate to ask a fellow member. If your engine doesn't meet the standard you should not fly until changes are made to be in compliance. Most engines can be quieted down with good muffler and propeller combinations. Excess noise is by far the biggest reason for complaints and the loss of flying fields. This is not optional, but it is an added cost to many.

We are making progress with our training program and I thank those who are willing to give their time and talent to assist in training newcomers to fly. This does not happen overnight but takes time and patience to make a good safe pilot. There are schools out there that will make you a pilot in a week (they claim). This may be so, but you have to pay for it. Our instruction is free, even if it takes a lot longer. It is a choice to make.

We now move our meetings indoors to the West Grove Fire Hall. This meeting room is next to the Drug Store and across from Marones Deli in downtown West Grove. (Actually on Rt. 841) There is plenty of parking in the municipal parking lot. Do not park in the Pharmacy parking lot adjacent to the railroad.
