#### Winter Hibernation

Before too many weeks of freezing weather go by, now is a good time to make sure that your model and field equipment are properly stored for the winter months. (Unless you're a member of the polar-bear flying club!)

The following tips will help ensure that your model is ready to fly next spring.

- Drain all the fuel from the fuel tank.
- Clean your engine and muffler, and use afterrun oil to prevent corrosion.
- Store any fuel you have in a tightly capped container where it is cool and dry.
- Disconnect your receiver battery pack to prevent corrosion in your onboard wiring and receiver.
- Charge all your batteries fully.
- Do not store batteries where it will be below freezing temperature.
- Recharge your starter battery at least every 6-8 weeks during the winter.
- Remember that large temperature and humidity changes can cause your model to warp. Store your model in a good location.
