Soon It Will Be Christmas Day!

Ah' yes, very soon that Jolly Ole Elf will be paying a visit to all good little radio control enthusiasts and who knows what shiny new toys will be left behind under our festively adorned trees?

Well, one thing is for sure, gas engines are coming into their own and one of the surprises Santa may have left is a nice new gas engine. If you're lucky enough to be the fortunate recipient of one of these small wonders you're going to want to get it in the place where it will do the most good, right away, and that will be on the business end of that hot model you already have just waiting for the right power plant. Now, that's all well and good and congratulations on your new toy. However, we want to take every precaution to operate this big knuckle buster safely which brings me to the topic we'll be treating in this article. The *Opto-Coupled Remote Gas Engine Kill Switch*.


Once you get this big gasser installed, which will probably be a fun job to occupy you during your Holiday break, you're going to be ready to make all

the connections, both mechanical and electrical. Besides having some means of operating the choke, either by servo or manually, (it's always nice to be able to choke these engines without sticking your fingers in the pudding), you'll be directing your attention to some means of activating/deactivating the engine ignition. This can be done quite nicely by means of an Opto-Coupled Remote Gas Engine Kill Switch which is controlled by your radio transmitter. This switching operation can be assigned to one of your radio channels associated with a bat handle switch on the radio transmitter. When the ignition is activated a **RED** LED (Light Emitting Diode) will be glowing, that is if you've thought to install it in a highly visible location on the airframe. A **RED** light means that the ignition is ready to fire-up and no red light indicates the ignition is safely off. This electronic kill switch can be purchased from any one of a variety of RC dealers, ranging in price from about \$20 to \$39. In fact some clubs make this feature a requirement.

Attached is a wiring diagram which should shed a little more light on the subject. Although the required ignition battery is shown to be any voltage from 4.8V to 20V, **BEWARE** of using any battery greater than 4.8V, lest you give your *Opto-Coupled Remote Gas Engine Kill Switch* the "hot foot" and/or blow up your engine ignition system! Also included is a photograph of the system components laid out so you can view the actual hardware and associate it with the schematic drawing.

2012 Election Results Academy elects new president, Bob Brown, to lead AMA

M U N C I E – The membership of the Academy of Model Aeronautics has concluded its balloting for president, executive vice president and three district vice presidents, electing Bob Brown of Bradford PA as the leader of the AMA's 143,000 members and 2,400 clubs.

The newly elected executive vice president is Gary Fitch of Franklinville NY. The new district vice presidents include Tim Jesky of Monroe MI for District VII, serving Michigan, Wisconsin, Minnesota and Iowa; Mike Mosbrooker of Oak Harbor WA for District XI, serving Washington, Oregon, Idaho, Montana and Alaska. All are three-year terms. Districts II and III vice president replacements for Fitch and Brown will be nominated and installed per AMA bylaws to serve until the next scheduled election.

"I will endeavor to earn the support of all our members," said Brown, who assumes the presidency immediately because it was vacated earlier this year by current AMA Executive Director Dave Mathewson. "It's a high honor. I look to continue the governing philosophy and success Dave had as president. There is much to do in 2012, so it's time for all of us in AMA leadership to roll up our sleeves and bring increased value to AMA membership."

On the Academy's near-term agenda are pending federal regulations affecting aeromodeling, something that has been in the works for more than three years and looks to be coming to a conclusion in the next few months. On the positive side, AMA has seen decreasing momentum in its nine-year membership slide with thousands of new youth members, bringing overall membership to 143,201, a rise from the previous membership year.

Fitch takes over the executive vice president position beginning in 2012 from Mark Smith of Arkansas, who had filled in for Mathewson after his transition to AMA staff leader in April. Jesky and Mosbrooker are new members to the Executive Council.
