


#### Cheap Incidence Meter Found While Wandering the Internet

Made for about \$1.00 and an investment of an hour or two.

- 1. Scan a school protractor into a graphics program (Turbocad 11 was a free download).
- 2. Edit to add a base and pivot point.
- 3. Print to a convenient size.
- 4. Paste the image onto 1/16th balsa (Use scrap, it's not important). Cut out the outline like the picture.
- 5. Beg, borrow or steal a clothes peg.
- 6. Epoxy a couple of 1 inch square pieces of thin plywood to the peg clamp faces.
- 7. Find a bolt that will slide snugly through the spring in the peg. Use a 3/32" machine screw, a nut and a few washers to suit. The indicator bearing is a Peck Polymer indoor prop bearing, or something similar.
- 8. Using wire to fit your bearing, bend at 90 degrees so that the short leg will pass through the bearing with a bit left over (about 1/8").
- 9. Bind & solder another piece of wire as a pointer to the long leg (see picture).
- 10. Make a 'Z' bend in the bottom leg away from the face. This is to let the weight swing clear.
- 11. Crimp a weight into the end of the pointer assembly (I used a small fishing sinker).
- 12. Drill a slightly undersize hole at the pivot location and ream it out so that the pivot bearing fits snug.
- 13. Test the bearing alignment by fitting the pointer and checking that it can swing freely and clear of the face. Turn the scale around and put a couple of tiny drops of cyano at the place where the bearing protrudes through the balsa. Use a toothpick or a pin to apply the glue. DON'T GET ANY GLUE ON THE WIRE!!!
- 14. Drill the bottom pivot point to suit your bolt. Harden the hole with a drop of cyano.
- 15. Bolt the assembly to the clothes peg using a washer on each side of the dial.
- 16. Tighten the nut gently; you want to be able to rotate the scale to set the pointer to zero.
- 17. Crimp a tiny piece of tubing to the overhanging pointer wire at the back of the bearing to secure it in place.

In use, it's handy to check wing & stabilizer incidences, D-T angles etc. In the photo it's attached to a HLG wing for checking control surface deflections.


